Geraldine B. Skopec was a farmer's daughter, a farmer herself as she worked hand in hand with her husband in growing and harvesting crops including hay. She grew chickens, geese, ducks, hogs, gardened both vegetables and flowers and milked cows. After they moved into Atkinson, she continued to raise chickens, dress them for sale, and garden on the farm. She always wanted to be a teacher and that is why this scholarship is given in her memory.

Geraldine was a very good cook and for several years in town provided room and board for Atkinson High and West Holt High students. She helped transplant plants in the farm greenhouse and sell them from the driveway of the house in Atkinson. Her friends remember her for her work in Atkinson Civic Improvement Garden Club and Extension Club, both of which she was president at on time. She was the custodian of the United Methodist Church for 11 years after Charley suffered a heart attack. He helped her as soon as he had recovered after a few weeks.

Charles G. Skopec was the son of a homesteader, a farmer, and worked for the P and P farms as a welder and constructor of livestock facilities.

Before he moved to Holt County, he worked with the ASCS measuring acres during the height of the Depression.

When he moved to Holt County, one of his first activities was to plant a windbreak with his wife, Geraldine and daughter Caroline.

He was a carpenter: building his own sweep and hay stacker, milk barn and milk house and with the help of a couple of farmers, an all-electric house in Atkinson. He sold garden produce for 62 years. He grew and sold plants for more than 30 years.

In 1951-53, Charles made a 4-H movie with the help of his friends and neighbors. In 1956 he wrote and produced a radio program for KVHC (now KBRX) in O'Neill with his neighbors. His hobby was electromagnetism.

They are survived by their daughter, Caroline J. Skopec Aten, who was a teacher/librarian for 26 years including 2 University Libraries and a son-in law, Gary J. Aten who retired to Atkinson after 40 years in the United Methodist Ministry.
